Halvikhulen

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Halvikhulen lies just south of the boundary between Sør- and Nord Trøndelag counties. This sea cave lies by an old abandoned farmhouse on a peninsula and can only be reached by boat or by walking for 4~5 hours on a faint path in rough terrain. The cave consists of an enormous entrance "hall" (which is an overhanging rock wall) more than 100 m long, about 50-60 m wide and 30-40 m high. Gradually it diminishes to a low, narrow passage that becomes too tight for further progress about 200 m from the entrance. A number of small, short passages leading off in various directions, connecting the main passage to a couple of parallel passages, brings the total length up to about 340 m. The cave is a sea cave, apparently controlled by a fault zone.
