Ingeniørgrotta 2007

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What was later named "Ingeniørgrotta" in Bonådalen inNordland, the Northern part of Norway, was discovered in1996 by Pål Henrik Gulbrandsen, and temporarily exploredby Iain Schrøder and Jan Erik Johansen, who also gave it itsname. In the years 1997-2007, except 1999, annual expeditions with various participants - whom are only mentioned by their first names - have explored the Ingeniørgrotta and othercaves connected with it. The entrance is in the wall some metres above the bottom of a 25 metres deep sink, some 440 ma.s.l., leading through narrow and muddy crawls to a series often pits. The system is far from fully explored, and many sidepassages and possible connections from the surface remain.
