Trip to Sunnmøre and Trøndelag June 2014

St Sunnivahulen, Selje, a church from 1000 AD [NGB 59 & 61] and Dollsteinhola, Sandøen, [Reusch,1877], were surveyed. At Voksa there were marine bowl-karren. Kannesteinen. Oppedal, 3 metre high, had been sculpted by the sea from potholes. Mandhullet, Ådalen [NGB 61] was located. 1870 & 1905 descriptions are published. [Translations available]. Gluggegrotta, & Kirkeporten were visited. Progress was difficult in Øvre Ramsåsgrotta. Tight and sinuous at 300m it is Verdal's longest cave. Jarlshola, Melhus, is a 15m long through-cave where the hillside has slipped. Håkon Sigurdsson stayed here, 995 AD, before he was murdered. Olaf Tryggvason, had a ransom on him but did not approve of his slave's action so he was killed. Gudrunhola, Flå, is named after an Oslo girl who disappeared in 1907. A psychic said she had been hidden there. Many people converged, and excavated it. She was later found dead in Oslo.
